**4 TO BEHAVE PROPERLY AT ALL TIMES
WHILST AT SCHOOL
(especially whilst in the playground and
grounds)**

I WILL ALWAYS

....remember that the school rules apply all the time

....remember the play equipment is out of bounds before and after school

....remember not to climb or play on the fences, steps or trees

....ask an adult in charge for permission before going to the toilet

....remember not to be an audience if other children fight

....stay in the correct play area at playtimes

....stand still when the whistle is blown

....take care of the school grounds

....wear the right clothes for the weather and wear them properly

3 TO LOOK AFTER PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

I WILL ALWAYS

...put things back, carefully and tidily, where they belong in the classroom and cloakroom

...tell the teacher if anything gets broken

...ask my parents to label my belongings

...place any litter that I see inside or outside into a litter bin

...look after my own things, (homework, clothing, books etc)

...return clothing and anything else I find to a teacher

...respect other peoples property and never take it or damage it

...use books, equipment, apparatus and toys properly, and safely.

SCHOOL RULES

We have four school rules which all children are expected to obey. These are:

- 1. Look after yourself.**
- 2. Look after others.**
- 3. Look after property and equipment.**
- 4. Behave properly at all times whilst at school.**

As each school rule is very broad we talk to the children about what they mean and provide a set of sentences illustrating the kind of behaviour we expect for each rule. The rules and examples are all contained in this code of conduct.

Please read the code with your child and stress how important it is to behave properly. We aim to help all our children grow into responsible, caring citizens. Making sure that children know that both home and school expect the same standards can play a major part in achieving this aim.

1. TO LOOK AFTER MYSELF

I WILL ALWAYS

-tell an adult if a stranger is seen near, or in the school
-tell an adult if I ever get hurt, ill or upset in any way (or get a friend to tell them for me) e.g. falling over
-politely ask anyone who keeps annoying me, to stop, tell an adult if anybody carries on after I have asked them to stop
-wash my hands after I have been to the toilet and before lunch
-pay attention to instructions and explanations
-sit properly on my chair
-walk sensibly in the building and always use the footpaths
-play calmly, sensibly, safely and kindly without hurting or up setting others
-make sure I have permission before leaving the school, and come back to my teacher if no-one is there to meet me.

2 TO LOOK AFTER OTHERS

I WILL ALWAYS

-use polite phrases and remember my manners e.g. please, thank you, excuse me
-hold the door open for the person coming behind me and allow visitors and adults to enter first
-work quietly in the classrooms and allow others to do the same
-listen quietly while others talk and wait patiently for my turn to speak
-look after new children and others who are sad, or hurt
-leave the cloakrooms and toilets clean and tidy
-tell an adult if I know that somebody in school is upset
-behave properly on my way to and from school
-treat all adults and children with respect, sharing and co-operating.
